RULE OF COURT 19-0001

Rule 4-16-17 of the Rules of Criminal Procedure of the Shoshone and Arapaho Law and Order Code (SALOC) authorizes the Chief Judge to promulgate rules governing criminal procedure. Pursuant to this authority the Court hereby establishes the following as pertaining strictly to supervised probation and supervised parole releases:

“Good Time Credit”

Good Time Credit is a sentence reduction given to probationers/parolees who maintain good behavior while on supervised release.


Good Time Credit shall be calculated by The Supervising Officer from the time of release until the date of non-compliance and/or date of incarceration.

Within the term of either Supervised Probation or Supervised Parole and only on the recommendation of the Probation Department can a probationer/parolee be granted Good Time Credit if the probationer/parolee’s supervision is revoked.

The implementation of this rule is to remind individuals that probation is a privilege, not a right. Also, pursuant to Section 6-6-4 Suspension of Sentence of the SALOC, “Any sentence may be suspended and the defendant placed on probation. As a condition of any probation, the Court may impose, and at any time modify, conditions of probation including or any other condition found reasonable and appropriate by the Court” (emphasis added).

The Court finds the establishment of this rule to be reasonable and appropriate under Section 6-6-4 and hereby formally adopts the Rule and shall make it available to the public for copy and inspection.
